Key Responsibilities:

- Plan and conduct rehearsals, ensuring students are prepared for school events, concerts, and external performances.
- Organize and oversee performances, including concerts and school ceremonies.

Teacher Responsibilities:

- Communicate with parents at Back-to-School Night, Parent-Teacher Conferences, and via email, phone, or in-person meetings.
- Serve as a mentor to 3-5 students.
- Collaborate with a teacher team to lead a homeroom.
- Participate in school traditions.



- Teachers are welcome to support student life as club moderators and sports coaches.
- Support admissions office with school visitors and open houses.
- Uphold school policies and perform other job responsibilities as requested.

Teacher Qualifications:

According to its mission and vision, Willows Academy is an all-female teaching and learning environment. The applicant must hold a bachelor's degree; a master's degree and teaching certification in the subject area is preferred.
